Went exploring to see what is open legally during the lockdown in LA. This week it was Legg Lake in El Monte. Facilities were closed, but you can run or walk around the 3 lakes in the large park. Parking lots were open, but it was uncrowded and it was very easy to maintain social distancing with margin. Big point is that it is free. The LA Arboretum and South Coast Botanic Garden are open by appointment via either membership or a paid ticket. Large Vincent Park in Inglewood is also still open, but the walkways may get a little traffic in some place, and depending on the time of day.
