As the title implies, the books includes accounts of the first class of the MISLp, both Nisei and white, back when the school started in a hangar at the Presidio in San Francisco. Entries for students and instructors vary in length and depth, depending on how much was willing to be shared. Most of the students were kibei, those educated to some extent in Japan, and so it ties in with the book mentioned last week, as well as Two Homelands, which I finished a bit earlier.

The story is a highly fictionalized version of the life of scholar, intellectual, community organizer, newspaperman, and soldier in the MIS during World War II, David Akira Itami, merged with the combat experiences of Harry Fukuhara. I have to read

Midnight in Broad Daylight by Pamela Rotner Sakamoto which tells Fukuhara's story.

Itami was a much more complex person than the character in Two Homelands and conflicted in a different way. If he hadn't committed suicide, he might have played an important role in postwar Little Tokyo.

As a side note, unlike the fictional version, Itami's wife was a nice person and his daughter Michi Itami is a noted visual artist..

A little earlier I finished reading Masao: A Nisei Soldier's Secret and Heroic Role in World War

by Sandra Vea is a biography of Masao Abe, a Kibei and MIS member who experienced a life similar in many ways to the character in Two Homelands, but without the internal conflicts, in spite of originally being educated to be a Japanese officer.
